

A New Year brings a reminder for those interested to apply for our bursaries and social justice award. There is plenty of time with the exception of the provincial, Bishop Pappin Bursary, due <u>January 31st</u>. If anyone knows a seminarian in need of funds, please apply for the provincial bursary below. The **Bishop Bernard F. Pappin Memorial Bursary** is for the purpose of assisting diocesan seminarians in need of personal financial support. financed by donations from Catholic Women's League Councils. The committee of the **Ontario Provincial Council** administers the Bursary. The committee will review the applications and award bursaries annually. Applications must be received by **January 31**st.

The **Spiritual Advisor's Bursary** is available to League members only. It shall be used to finance education at any level: university, college, technical school, etc. The names of the Diocesan Spiritual Advisor Bursary recipients are not made public. Application deadline April 1st.

J. L. Hennessey Education Bursary is available to any League member or her immediate family. It shall be used 13 to finance education at any level: university, community colleges, technical school, etc. 14 The names of the J. L. Hennessey Education Bursary recipients are not made public. Application deadline April 1st.

Life Members and Past Presidents Social Justice Award The award is intended to recognize men or women engaged in social justice work. A person will be eligible to receive the award upon a nomination form being submitted by March 1st



Mary Jean Horne from St. Ursula's, Chatham was Diocesan President from 2012 – 2014. Mary Jean joined The Catholic Women's League in 1960. As a young girl she admired her best friend, who was from a devoted Catholic family. Her mom believed that families worked together and prayed together. She told her friend that when she was 16, she was going to turn Catholic. She

joined the League to pursue this goal of working and praying together with women of faith. Special events or projects during her presidency were: Catch the Fire Workshops, continued the CWL Retreat Day at Our Lady of the Rosary Shrine in Merlin and supported the National initiative "Postcards against Pornography". In her own words, "To me the League has helped me grow in faith. I have been truly blessed to meet so many wonderful and loving women from across the country. I have made many lifelong friendships. The League has taught me grace, confidence and courage. The League is part of me and each day I thank Our Lady of Good Counsel and God to be part of this wonderful group of women". Mary Jean was selfless in her dedication and support of her church and community. She volunteered for many years with the former St Joseph's Hospital and Chatham-Kent Health Alliance in various volunteer positions and received her pin for 45 years of volunteer service. She found her true passion in the Catholic Women's League, becoming a member in 1960. She went on to serve as President for the London Diocese from 2012 to 2014 and Past President from 2014 to 2016. In 2016 she was awarded a lifetime membership for her 62 years of service. For several years she was also a member of the St. Ursula's Church staff team in the role of Pastoral Care Assistant, meeting with family members and helping them make arrangements for the funeral of their loved ones. Mary Jean's funeral was held on October 27th, 2022 at 1pm. It was an honour to attend this celebration of her life. It was evident to all in attendance the impact that Mary Jean's life of service had. She touched so many lives in various ways. The honour guard outside the church included more than 85 Women. She was a friend to many and will be greatly missed.


100th Anniversary Council Celebration
